This March the Sutton Lodge of Perfection will be honoured to present a most special and stirring performance of the Fourteenth Degree, Grand Elect Mason. This degree marks the apex of our progress toward perfection and as such will be presented with the solemnity of Blue Lodge degrees. The degree itself is metaphorically presented within the Secret Vault under the Sanctum Sanctorum of the now-completed Temple of Solomon. The Vault is adorned with the sacred furniture, later taken by Nebuchadnezzar II in 587 BCE following the temple's destruction and which reappears in the Fifteenth Degree to follow. But at least for the present, all is perfect: the Word has not been lost, Solomon's Temple still stands, and all the symbols of perfection are at hand.

After the formal opening, a review of the thirteen degrees that preceded it, and the subsequent Inquiry of the exemplar, we move on to the Aroba, an ancient ceremony of friendship that includes the breaking of bread together with the drinking of wine with the candidates. We shall then break to continue enjoying the bonds of fellowship over cocktails and hors d'oeuvres in our dining hall, followed by a festive board. At the conclusion of our meal, we shall return to the Lodge where the balance of the degree will be presented, culminating with the invocation of the Ineffable Name of the Almighty and the blessing of all Brethren. All will then be invited to join in an afterglow.

My officers and I will already have been hard at work preparing for this presentation by the time you read these words, and we are confident that it will warm your hearts, giving you an early taste of the promise of the spring that blessedly will arrive only ten days later. We sincerely hope that you will all be able to favor us with your attendance at this especial event and I personally look forward to seeing you there.

SCOTTISH RITE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Scottish Rite Commitment to Education

ne of Freemasonry's fundamental principles is a belief in the importance of the educated mind. Freedom, understanding, and brotherhood are dependent upon our ability to reason effectively. That is why the Masonic Fraternity, and the Scottish Rite in particular, have long been committed to fostering the value of education.

At a time when the cost of higher education is increasing, the Scottish Rite wants to assist qualified and deserving students in attaining their educational and career goals through its scholarship program.

As part of Supreme Council Charities, the Education and Charity Fund Scholarship Program has now been expanded. It is anticipated that many more scholarships will be awarded each year to eligible and deserving students attending colleges and universities of their choice and studying subjects of their choice.

The Abbott Scottish Rite Scholarship Program is supported by gifts from members and friends of Scottish Rite Masons to the annual Blue Envelope Appeal.

Eligibility Requirements

A pplicants for a scholarship must be children of Scottish Rite Masons. Or, they may be members of youth organizations sponsored by the Masonic Fraternity.

An applicant must be a graduate of a public or private secondary/preparatory school.

Application forms are only available through the Supreme Council on-line website: www. scottishritenmj.org. Completed applications must be returned to the Valley Secretary in duplicate. Applications must be in the hands of the Valley Secretary (not postmarked) by April 1.

The Amount of Scholarship Aid

Both the number of scholarships granted each year and the actual amount of individual scholarships are dependent upon funds available. It is hoped, however, that individual grants will range from \$500 to \$1,000. The number in any state will be modest inasmuch as fifteen states and 100 Valleys are concerned.

Supplemental Guide to Scottish Rite Scholarships

Massachusetts Council of Deliberation

The following additional eligibility requirements are provided for guidance in applying for scholarship assistance in Massachusetts:

- Applicant must be enrolled as an undergraduate student.
- Scholarship recipients may reapply annually for additional undergraduate assistance in competition with all other annual applicants.
- The applicant and the father of the applicant who must be a Scottish Rite Mason from the Valley of Salem, may reside outside the state.
- A transcript of record must be submitted with application along with a copy of SAT/Entrance Exam scores.
- A copy of parent's/guardian's most recent year federal tax return that includes gross family income (Form 1040 front section) must be included.
- Suggestions: Do not be limited by space. Give supporting data on family conditions siblings in college self-help extra-curricular, church, and community activities, etc.

Applications must be submitted to the state Committee through the Valley where the Scottish Rite relative holds his Lodge of Perfection, 14°, membership. Members of Masonic youth organizations should apply through the Valley in which they reside. Scholarship award checks will be issued, to the recipient only, in two installments—the first at the time of the award, the second at the successful completion of the first semester or term. Hi-de-ho, Brethren:

Just think, about another foot or two of snow, and then SPRING! A hope of life rising anew. The potential for growth for the future. Translation — it's time to invite your

Masonic friends to join the Valley of Salem. You have a good time with us, right? And isn't a good time magnified when it is shared? So, wouldn't you think that YOUR good times with us will be even better with more of your friends there? Of course you would. No real work on your part. Just tell them to show up with their initiation fee (\$90.00, check made out to Valley of Salem) and the smiling Secretary will take it from there. Couldn't be simpler. The first step is up to you.

About the time you receive this notice, the first dues bills of our 2018 year (starts on March 2, 2017 and ends on March 1, 2018) should be arriving. Three things – first, if your bill shows that you have arrears, it means you owe last year's and well as this year's dues. At least that's what the records show. If you think there is an error or if you want to talk things over, PLEASE do not ignore this. Unless I hear otherwise from you, the records are assumed to be correct. If the records show that you that you still owe last year's dues and I do not hear from you, there is a very, very good chance that action will be taken in the first half of June. No one, especially me, wants this to happen, but it is your call.

Second, For the first time in over ten years we have had to yield to circumstances and increase dues by \$4.00 per body. So, for most of us the bill will be \$16.00 for each of three bodies plus the assessment from the Supreme

Council of \$27.00 (think of it as the Scottish Rite equivalent of Grand Lodge's dues which are paid through your Lodge) for a total of \$75.00. Hopefully this will not be a major problem for anyone, but if your financial circumstances are tight, please write or call me and we will CONFIDENTIALLY work something out.

Third, our Treasurer loses sleep when he learns of unpaid dues. Do your part to see to the continued good health of our much beloved Treasurer. Pay your dues right away. It's the charitable thing to do.

Another thing that should not be forgotten is that any of you who have children either currently in or about to be in college, Abbott Scholarship applications have to be IN MY HOT LITTLE HANDS, by April 1. Send them to my home in Gloucester, not to the Masonic Building in Salem. If you send anything to Salem, it will arrive in my hands too late and there will be nothing I can do. College ain't cheap these days, so have your kid(s) go to the Supreme Council (Northern Masonic Jurisdiction)'s website, print out the application and instructions and get to work. Also tell them that one of the prime reason for rejection is failure to follow those instructions and send ALL the requested information. More information on the Scholarships is elsewhere in this notice. Good luck to all
